

## NEW JERSEY SIRE STAKES INSTRUCTIONS AND CONDITIONS

BEFORE A STALLION CAN BE ACCEPTED AND REGISTERED AS A SIRE WHOSE FOALS ARE ELIGIBLE TO THE NEW JERSEY SIRE STAKES PROGRAM, SAID STALLION MUST COMPLY WITH THE CONDITIONS DRAWN AND REGULATED BY THE STANDARDBRED BREEDERS & OWNERS ASSOCIATION OF NEW JERSEY, INC. AND THE NEW JERSEY SIRE STAKES BOARD OF TRUSTEES.

1. Chapter 85 of the New Jersey Public Laws of 1071:  
“Those horses eligible to race under said Sire Stakes Program shall be any foal of any registered New Jersey Stallion standing at a New Jersey breeding farm and either owned by a resident of the State of New Jersey or leased by a resident thereof for a period of not less than ten (10) years to stand a full season on a New Jersey breeding farm.”
2. This registration must be returned by January 1, 2016
3. The fee for annual registration of a stallion shall be due on or before December 1 of the approaching breeding season. The fee shall accompany the registration application.  
FEES: \$ 750 – If stud fee is up to \$ 1,000.00  
\$ 1,000 – If stud fee is between \$ 1,000.01 and \$ 5,000.00.  
\$ 1,500 – If stud fee is between \$ 5,000.01 and \$ 15,000.00 or Private Treaty  
\$ 2,000 – If stud fee is over \$15,000.01
4. Once the registration fee has been paid, there will be no refunds.
5. Syndicates standing a stallion in New Jersey where the syndicate is owned by non-residents of the State of New Jersey must file a lease agreement with the SBOANJ attesting that the stallion is leased to a New Jersey resident for a period of not less than ten (10) years. If this stallion is syndicated or under any kind of partnership or joint ownership, a complete list of all owners and their addresses must accompany this application each year. Please attach list if applicable.
6. In order for any stallion leased to a resident of the State of New Jersey to be eligible for registration on the Official Stallion Register of the SBOANJ, a full and complete copy of the lease of not less than ten (10) years duration shall be filed with the United States Trotting Association and the SBOA/NJ.  
A New Jersey resident, as the term issued in these regulations, is a New Jersey domiciliary. A New Jersey domiciliary is a person, corporation, partnership or other legal entity which:
  - a) For a person: has a place of abode in the State of New Jersey with one’s family, if any, and who has demonstrated intention to make New Jersey one’s permanent home.
  - b) For a corporation, partnership or other legal entity: is entirely, legally and beneficially owned and controlled by a New Jersey domiciliary, as defined in (a) above, or is the owner of real property in the State of New Jersey where standardbred horses are stabled, trained, bred and/or raced with sufficient physical facilities to house and stable all of the horses owned and trained by said legal entity.
7. The stallion must be on the farm by January 1, 2016. A dual hemisphere stallion must be on the farm by February 15, 2016.
8. A Certificate of Good Health must be completed by a licensed New Jersey veterinarian on the farm where the stallion is standing sometime between January 1 and January 21, 2016. The Certificate of Good Health signed by the veterinarian is to be sent along with a copy of a negative Coggins test, drawn at the time of the exam, to the SBOANJ by February 15, 2016.

***Special Note for Dual Hemisphere Stallions ONLY:*** The Certificate of Good Health for a dual hemisphere stallion must be completed by a licensed New Jersey veterinarian on the farm where the stallion is standing sometime between February 15 and March 1, 2016. The Certificate of Good Health, signed by the veterinarian, is to be sent along with a copy of the EIA-AGID test chart to the SBOA/NJ by March 15, 2016.

Failure to file the Certification of Good Health & EIA-AGID test chart by the above stated date could result in the loss of registration of the stallion and/or the eligibility of the foals to the New Jersey Sire Stakes Program.

9. Condition #2 of the New Jersey Sire Stakes Program:
  - a) In order to qualify for the New Jersey Sire Stakes, a foal must be the product of the mare with a New Jersey registered and resident stallion. The mare to be bred must either be a resident at the farm on which the stallion stands or be bred on a farm in New Jersey.
  - b) Horses bred via interstate semen transport are eligible for the NJSS program provided the stallion is registered with the SBOA/NJ pursuant to the NJAC 2:23-2.3 and meets all other applicable requirements.
10. Condition #4 of the New Jersey Sire Stakes Program:

A stallion, in order for his foals to be eligible for the NJ Sire Stakes Program, must stand for breeding purposes the full season, extending from January 1 through December 31, on a farm in New Jersey, and shall not be moved from the farm on which he was registered without the prior permission (excluding medical emergency) of the Sire Stakes Board of Trustees. Dual hemisphere stallions must be on the farm by February 15 of the year they are registered and may be granted permission to leave the farm after July 15 of the year in which they are registered *provided they have been registered as a dual hemisphere stallion*. A stallion shall not be permitted to race during a registered breeding year, which is January 1 through December 31, except in accordance with NJAC 2:32-2.3 (f) (Condition #30). The foals of a stallion that does race or is moved without prior permission of the Sire Stakes Board of Trustees during a registered breeding year will not be eligible to the Sire Stakes.
11. This registration makes the foals of the stallion named on the reverse side eligible to be nominated to the following:
  - a) New Jersey Sire Stakes
  - b) New Jersey Bred and/or Sired Races
  - c) Charles I Smith Trotting Classic (Open and Filly Divisions)
  - d) New Jersey Sired overnight events
  - e) Harold R. Dancer Memorial Trot (Open and Filly Divisions) {foals of participating stallions
  - f) only}
  - g) Lou Babic Memorial Two-Year-Old Pace (Open and Filly Divisions)
  - h) D'Altrui Miss New Jersey
  - i) New Jersey Futurities
  - j) Abbatiello Jersey Pacing Classic

Sires of horses eligible for the events listed above must have been registered with the SBOANJ at the time of mating.

12. If any of the above conditions are not met, the stallion will be deemed ineligible to be a Registered New Jersey Stallion.
